

Drug Fact Sheet Danger ~ Heroin Mixed With Other Dangerous Substances

- All drugs are potentially dangerous
- A number of dangerous substances have been found in heroin purchased in NJ.
- Other dangerous drugs and substances are being sold as heroin
- Drugs mixed into heroin or being sold as heroin have serious health risks.
- > These risks include everything from lack of the expected effects to increased risk of overdose death.
- In 2015, there have been over **3,000** naloxone (NARCAN®) administrations, by EMS and law enforcement in New Jersey, to treat potential fatal overdoses.

Prevention Recommendations

- Don't do dangerous drugs by yourself Having a partner will increase the likelihood of surviving if you experience an unexpected medical condition.
- Call for help Law enforcement will assist you and your friends in a medical emergency and you will not be arrested for possession of illicit drugs found at scene. (NJ Overdose Prevention Act)
- Do not share hypodermic needles or use previously used needles. Sharing hypodermic needles greatly increases the chance of contacting dangerous diseases and infections.

Contaminants & Dangers

Fentanyl/Acetyl Fentanyl ~ Stops you from breathing. Greater risk of DEATH than heroin. 15-20 times stronger than heroin.

<u>Clenbuterol</u>[~] Tremors, anxiety, dangerously high heart rate, chest pain, dangerously high or low blood pressure.

Methamphetamine Tremors, muscle cramps, clenching teeth (breaking teeth), fast heart rate, dangerously high temperatures.

Cocaine™ Heart attack, stroke, tremors, anxiety, dangerously high heart rate, dangerously high or low blood pressure.

<u>Caffeine</u>~ Tremors, anxiety, dangerously high heart rate, difficulty falling asleep, nausea and vomiting, increased urination; in some people difficulty urinating at all

<u>Codeine</u>~ Can stop you from breathing; some individuals are highly allergic to this drug.

Meprobamate ~Sleepy, trouble with activities that require you to be alert (driving, working); can stop you from breathing.
