Program Background

MCADA has proudly held the DMHAS grant to oversee the **Mercer County Opioid Overdose Recovery Program (OORP)** since 2017. Over the past several years, the program has delivered services to more than **1,200 individuals** experiencing opioid-related challenges, offering vital bedside intervention, follow-up support, and connections to recovery resources.

Core Responsibilities

- Provide coverage and back up for intervention dispatch.
- Respond **in-person within 20–30 minutes** to dispatches at any of the four Mercer County hospitals or designated community/treatment provider locations.
- Conduct and document follow-up phone calls for each client for a **minimum of 8 weeks** following the initial bedside intervention.
- Attend regular **weekly or bi-weekly supervisions** and case reviews with the OORP Patient Navigator.
 - Participate in **monthly clinical supervision** with the OORP Program Supervisor.
- Provide outreach in the community and work collaboratively with other agencies and treatment providers.
- Assist Patient Navigator with administrative duties as assigned.

Essential Qualifications

- Current or in progress Certified Peer Recovery Specialist (CPRS) or National Certified Peer Recovery Support Specialist (NCPRSS) credential.
- Ability and commitment to maintain active certification.
- High School Diploma or higher
